DAVE KELLY: You may not realize that we actually have a Colonel (and a veteran of Desert Storm) in our midst. Look for someone quietly jotting down notes for the Linking Ring and you'll find him. Dave Kelly bought himself a REMCO "Sneaky Pete Magic Set with some Christmas money when he was about 10 years old. The set was great, including several small illusions such as a Mirror Box and a Sawing in Half Doll! He performed many shows as a kid with this set, by then he discovered Kanter's Magic shop in Philadelphia. His purchases were few and far between because he didn't have any money, but the Kanter's catalogue got a lot of use in creating dreams of magic!

Like many of us he enjoyed watching Mark Wilson's Magic Land of Alakazam on TV and also the Magic Ranch show, but only rarely saw live magic, mainly magicians who appeared on the Steel Pier in Atlantic City.

Like many of us, he drifted away from performing in high school and college, but kept hold of most of his magical treasures and books. He served in the Marine Corps for three years of active duty, and began a career as a coach and high school teacher after release from active duty.

During his honeymoon his wife Terrie and he went to his first real live illusion type show, the touring company of Doug Henning's "The Magic Show". But what really rekindled his interest in magic was a course in Magic at Delaware County Community College in 1978. After completing the basic and advanced course with an excellent teacher, Mike Adelman, he continued to meet with several of the students including Mark Bruley, Gil Cacciutti, and Joe Van Hart. When John Wade joined the group, they formed the Delaware County Conjurers' Club, the start of our present ring. At first they met in each other's homes, but soon began to meet at the old Fireside Restaurant in Springfield. While secretary, he started the first club newsletter, a little ditto one page thing that he ran off at his school! Greer Cheeseman took it over and published it for many years after that.

Dave served as president of the club at least twice over the years, and was a member when we decided to affiliate with the IBM in the 1980s. He also helped to stage manage some of our public shows at the Marple Players Club. But one of his most important jobs is submitting the ring reports to The Linking Ring.

While doing all of this, he also kept teaching and managed to stay active in the Marine Corps reserve. He often uses magic while doing presentations to military classes all over the country. When he performs today, it is mostly for birthday parties and club-type events, as well as holiday performances in his high school classes.

Dave claims to be one of the "dinosaurs" of the club, there from the beginning and still loving all the magic that he learns and shares with the members. Heck, he also got to meet people like Jeff McBride and Harry Blackstone, Jr., at our club.
