Bob Little's Super Sunday Review

On November 19th, the latest Bob Little's Super Sunday was held. It was one of his best to date. There is always a lot to do and there is a great deal of magic to be learned and purchased.

This time Bob treated us to the extremely talented and generally impressive, Arthur Trace. Arthur was a winner at the last FISM and he is one of a kind. His style and talent in manipulation is, in my opinion, second to none. I have seen quite a few of the standard manipulators with the typical "tuxedoed magician", but Arthur brings a new life and vitality to the art. To paraphrase him, Magic is an art form all its own and creativity defines it. Well, he certainly gave manipulation a new definition.

The auction was great, but went a little long. Hank Moorehouse always does a great job as auctioneer. He has a great breadth and depth of knowledge of magical effects, so it is always useful to get his opinion on effects before bidding on them. There was also a guest auctioneer in the person of Marc DeSousa. Great job Marc!

The lecture with Arthur Trace was entertaining and I learned quite a bit of new magic.

The stage show was the best one I have seen at a Super Sunday. Well worth the \$30.00 all by itself. It is the best bargain in magic today. The next one will be on June 24th in 2007. Put it on your calendar and come to have a great time.

Not Just Routine "Online Lie Detector Card Trick"

I have encountered quite a clever card trick online that is different than you may have previously seen. This trick actually lets your participant pick any card they want as long as you know what it is. It also appears to have them control the entire trick with them at the computer. It is quite ingenious.

To read the instructions on how to actually perform the online trick, you must go to the following site,

http://www.jbum.com/liedetector/ decoderring.html. There the entire trick will be explained. Do this without your participant present. Once you have read and understand the instructions, go to the web site of

http://www.heaven.com/liedetecto r/. This will start the trick. Remember on the first screen to click slightly outside of the button so the trick will be unlocked.

The basic premise of the trick is that the spectator you are working with will be able to select any card in the deck. They will write down the card they selected on a Post-it note and stick it on the computer screen. At this point the computer will ask the spectator "yes or no" questions about their card. The spectator can either lie or tell the truth. The computer will be able to know whether the spectator is lying or telling the truth. At the end of the trick, the computer will reveal the card of the spectator. It can be repeated as many times as the magician wants to repeat it. It can definitely work with any card and the magician can even force a card if they do not want the spectator to think the magician knows what it is. I am very impressed with this

particular internet trick. Many times tricks on the internet in which the spectator must use a computer are a bit lame. This one has been engineered in a very clever and deceptive way, to truly make it easy for the magician and amazing to the spectator.

Another good trick for the mentalist with a computer is Meta Scope. This was created by the same person as the previous trick in this article.

Meta Scope is a screen saver that you download to your computer that acts as a Mind Reading Oracle. To have it perform effectively you will need to have an active internet connection while doing the trick. I would recommend that you also download the instruction manual to get the full effect of the trick.

Basically what happens is that the spectator sees your screensaver running on your computer. You, the magician, would say to the participant to think of anything in the world and tell you of what he is thinking. Once the spectator has told you what they are thinking about, you tell them to concentrate on the screensaver intently and to picture the subject of which they are thinking.

As the spectator concentrates on the screen saver, the display changes to random pictures of the subject of the spectator's thoughts. It is quite clever and very effective. It is a good addition to your bag of computer magic tricks and really brings magic effectively into the computer era. Have fun with these effects. December 11th Meeting has a Special Bonus!!!
