


Current needs for our club for 2009:

November Ring Report

November 2007 Ring 6 Report

President Forrest Chapman went to great lengths to make our annual Close-Up Contest one of the best yet. To make it true Close-Up, Forrest set up three tables around the hall, with about 10 seats at each table. Everyone kept score on sheets with categories for presentation, skill, entertainment, etc. About 10 members competed for the awards, and a guest or two performed.

Professor Rem opened with a Scam: A 4 card monte. Three of the cards had normal backs, one had red number eights all over it. Then the red eights turned blue, then green, then yellow. The faces of the cards

changed, then all of the backs turned red! Rem showed how to do a perfect tear of a paper napkin that resulted in a perfect circle. When the torn piece was opened, it was instead a star! Mike Scanzello produced a bottle opener and then a full bottle of orange soda from his shoe! He then executed a beautiful torn and restored signed playing card. Great stuff!

Visitor Joshua Mosado had a nice Linking Ring routine with 5 inch rings and some amazing links that took place in a volunteer's hand. Great handling of a classic! Reba Strong began with her version of the Han Ping Chien coin effect, where one coin invisibly joins two others in her hands. She then showed off her "Nothing Machine", actually a miniature Pom-Pom trick. She finished with a display of card versatility. She made a fan of cards grow smaller. then return to normal size. She placed four Aces into the deck and then reproduced them with a series of one-handed cuts!

Young magician Yoseph showed his prowess with a nice Professor's Nightmare, then skill and mature presentation skills with a Coin Matrix, where four coins magically jumped under different playing cards on the table. David Hale showed off his skills with cards. A spectator chose a deck for him to use, then selected a card from the deck. Dave then brought out a sealed deck, and the selected card appeared in this deck face up! Then all of the cards in the sealed deck changed to the selected card!

Another young magician, Dennis, showed great skill with a rope effect. The rope had two ends, then

three, then four! It then turned into a loop with no ends! Some of the magic took place when Dennis placed the ropes into the hands of a spectator! He then did a stand-up version of Cups and Balls! Ralph Armstrong dazzled with a series of card effects. He produced aces from shuffled card packets, had a volunteer (me!) help and pick out piles that now had only single suits in each pile! All without a single "funny" move or sleight (that I could see!).

Richie B amazed with great patter and a single silver dollar that soon multiplied into four coins. The coins vanished one by one, then reappeared inside of a coin purse that he had shown empty at the start of the routine. He finished with a card effect: A card selected by a volunteer. Richie shuffled it into the deck. Then he drew a card onto the back of a card. He showed us the drawing, but it was not the selected card! No problem for Richie - a drawing of the selected card rose from the first drawing on the back of the card. Wowl
