


The March Meeting is Variety Night

How do you Spell Love?

Last month having been February, I thought it may be appropriate to capture the imaginations of the readers of our newsletters with this title. I will never forget a man named Larry Clayton who posed this question when I was in college. He asked, "How do you spell love?" His answer was "T-I-M-E." In other words, if you love God, you are going to spend time with God. If you love your family, you are going to make time for them. If you love golfing, you are going to make time for and spend time golfing. If you love the NBA, you will watch the playoffs, check the box scores in the paper, follow your favorite team, etc.

Here's the point. If you love magic, you will spend time reading magic books. You will become more knowledgeable in the history, theory, and technique of magic. You will spend time watching performances. You will notice what makes a good performer good and what makes a mediocre performer mediocre. You will spend time practicing. You will spend time in rehearsal. Here is where the vast majority of magicians drop the ball. They love to watch lectures. They love to read books. They love to watch DVDs. But they rarely practice. The most common reply to this is, "But I don't have time." Everyone has the same amount of time in a day. God created each day to be 24 hours long. How we manage that time and how we spend our opportunities will determine how much we can accomplish in a 24 hour period. Here are some ideas to make time for technique. While you are driving to work each day, spend time memorizing the Aaronson stack. Perhaps invent a

new routine in your mind. If you watch television, never watch television without practicing your coin roll, ball roll, pen spin, classic pass, false shuffle, sybil cut, coin rollout, etc. While you read, prop the book open and practice your one-handed top palm, your ring flourish, your silk vanish, or your thumb-fan. Always carry a coin with you. This is the way to become proficient at the classic palm, the Downs' palm, the thumb palm, the Motube palm, and the back palm.

Hopefully this will be a starting point to help you make the most out of every moment of the day. Don't forget to block out time in your schedule to rehearse in front of a mirror. Memorize your script and movements. May love for the craft make us all better magicians.

President Forrest Chapman introduced our visiting lecturer. Garrett Thomas, with a great overview of the magic that we would be enjoying tonight. Garrett opened with several eye-catching bits of magic. He scrambled a Rubic's Cube, then instantly solved the puzzle. He had a finger ring that vanished from one hand and constantly reappeared on his other hand. Then, he did an amazing coin routine where the coins multiplied, vanished, went from one hand to the other, and then vanished into a purse top. Just as suddenly, the coins transformed into larger coins, and finished up with a jumbo 6" coin. He had our attention after that.

As Garrett tipped and taught the effects, he was more concerned with sharing his theory of magic, performance, and entertainment. A key part of this theory of magic is that you need an audience for a trick to become magic. The magic takes place in the spectator's mind. In close-up magic he works to create the gift of astonishment.

Throughout the night,
Garrett said that each magician
needs to choose the magic and moves
that fit him or her. He noted that in
his work with David Blaine, the famous TV magician, picks tricks that
work for him.

Another technique of Garrett is to tell your audience a little bit about the real you. This helps connect with the audience, and they remember you, not just your magic. There must also be a string of logic throughout an effect. He also talked about simplicity in magic and routines. Perhaps the simplest, best bit of his philosophy was his Big New Rule of Magic: "Don't move when you're talking, and don't talk when you are moving." WOW!
