

I think that all of us who perform kid's shows have a built in ego check (and that's a good thing - I think). As a performer we are often paid high complements (strangely enough, even if the material isn't all that great). I find that many magicians' heads are way too big for their ability. To be a good magician, one has to study narrative, theater, comedy, sleight of hand, audience management, psychology, and a host of other things. Many magicians work so hard in these areas and spend hours honing their skills and mastering the art. One can imagine himself receiving accolades and honors. He may even receive these in real life. He may receive many complements. He may receive wonderful audience reactions. He may have a full performing schedule. All these things can make one start to think that he is hot stuff. But then there's the ultimate equalizer: the kid's show.

One can come off of a high paying gig where his mode of selfexpression was appreciated by all. And it never fails. The next day he walks into a kid's show and the Barney theme song is playing, "I love you. You love me. We're a happy family..." The parents think for some reason that a 2-year old can sit through a 45-minute show. He toddles around and throws your stuff all over the living room. Grandpa heckles you with several "original" lines like, "Can you make my wife disappear?" The 2-year old starts screaming during the show because he hurt himself on one of your expensive props and now all you can think of is "lawsuit" as you wrap up the disaster. To top it off, the birthday child kicks you in the shins. You now hate being a magician and

contemplate quitting for the 7,000th time. A normal job as a salesman suddenly looks appealing. But most importantly, the ego has been deflated. You are no longer the king of the world, you are just you. And you walk out of the kid s show a normal human being. But most importantly, you walk out of that kid's show just being you.

Do I love doing kid's shows? Sometimes. But sometimes I hate doing them. But it's the times that I hate doing them that they are the healthiest for me.

effects, then he broke it down into simple components so that we could all learn the main points.

John began with his version of John Kennedy's amazing shrinking deck. First he took a regular deck from a card box, then the box shrunk! Then the cards shrunk! Then they got large again. He combined it with a card reveal. All very simple to do.

Next was Michigan Monte, done with four large, ungimmicked cards. An Ace kept jumping to the table, and finally the three blank cards turned into Aces! Another card effect had a signed card vanish from the deck and appear in his pocket. He even repeated the effect and still fooled us!

In a break from cards, he showed three differently colored balls, which vanished one at a time from his hands. Then he vanished all of them at once.

Another card effect used a Z Fold wallet very effectively to produce the climax.

John's notes and book sold well at the break. He gave us a full evening of great learning of new magic.
